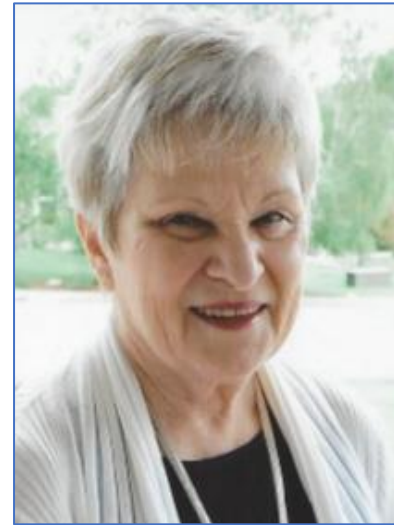

Candy has sung in many quartets over the years including Regional Quartet Champions in 1982 and International semi-finalist in Fulltime Enjoyment and 1990 Regional Quartet Champions Mountain Music Company.

In Region 24 Director of Musical Activities (DMA) where she founded the Gold Country Chorus (a chorus of quartet champions), the first Regional Quartet Workshops, the first Director Workshops and orchestrated 10 Summer Music Schools (Gold Rush). Also in Region 24 she was Competition Coordinator for six years. Candy has coached many choruses and quartets through the years. In Region 13 she is Competition Coordinator and was on the faculty at Northwest Harmony College in 2016. She is currently mentoring a new director.

COMMENTS ON NOMINEE'S QUALIFICATIONS:

To quote Cathy Conley's words in a 2001 article, Candy 'has never met a job she didn't like, and never met a challenge she wouldn't tackle. This bundle of energy has been directing Five Valley Chorus in Missoula, Montana since 1983 and their list of accomplishments under her helm is mind-boggling'. Some of Candy's accomplishment include: Regional chorus champions eight times including being the smallest chorus ever on the International stage in 1985 in Kansas City and being on stage in Calgary with 111 members in 2007. By invitation, the Five Valley Chorus performed at Carnegie Hall in 1990 and in 2000 the Buckeye Invitational, a Small Chorus Festival at State Fair in Columbus OH. They also appeared in an International video on directing and building a quality small chorus and in 2016 appeared at the International Choral Festival in Missoula MT. Candy has masterfully managed small and large numbers of dual members throughout the years bringing wonderful voices to her chorus, but also providing chorus members from other choruses in Montana, Idaho and Washington the opportunity to experience the International stage.

Candy is the heart and soul of Five Valley Chorus. She is a strong educator who finds methods to teach music theory and vocal production in ways that all chorus members can feel and understand. She works

tirelessly outside of chorus practice and gives her time and energy to all things Sweet Adelines – she is our greatest ambassador in the community and a support and sister in harmony to each and every chorus member. She is excited to meet the challenges of singing and competing in Region 13 and feeling that sisterhood with its members.

Oh yes, she also has a life outside of Sweet Adelines. She recently retired after 20 years as a grade school principal following 25 years of being a music teacher extraordinaire. Her retirement life includes playing piano for church every Sunday and directing the church choir, being the wedding organizer for church, teaching private piano, serving on the board for Missoula Aging Services, supervising student teachers for the University of Montana, mentoring two teachers at her previous school and teaching piano classes for Adult Education. Years ago she sang for a short two years with the Fleetwoods and has recently added to her non-barbershop performing experiences by singing with the Gary Gillette Big Band in Missoula! Candy is also a proud and active member of the University of Montana Alumni Band. On top of that, she spends as much time as possible with her energetic young grandsons!
