Judges Observations from our 2022 Regional Competition

Choruses

• Vocal skills are good. Choruses are selecting appropriate and manageable arrangements. Video recording great. Faces are animated. Nice work directors – good conducting skills and performing in the chorus.

- Education opportunities:
 - Continuous tone flow: vowel-to-vowel singing and lyric flow, continue flow to the end of the phrase, forward motion
 - Synchronization, notes, intervals, tuning, section/part accuracy need attention
 - Lyric flow, phrasing, forward motion, lyrical plans to present the complete story
 - Characterization: emotional, physical, musical can always use work
 - Audience connection should be a priority. A genuine connection presented in a sincere way, using natural body language along with a character-based visual plan

Quartets

• Vocal skills good. Videos well done. Phrase plans for ballads were a strength for many quartets. Good costuming, facial animation, and body language.

Judges Observations continued

- Education opportunities:
 - Resonance: expand, including nasal pharyngeal resonance (where the overtones live)
 - Forward motion: using breath to propel into the next phrase
 - Instant accuracy: fine tuning in the area of harmony accuracy was often overlooked
 - Select appropriate music to skill level; take advantage of barbershop style
 - Interpretive plans: expand on, take some risks, have fun
 - Uptunes: use pulse to create drive and excitement (faster is not always better)
 - Characterization: focus on natural, sincere, genuine immersion in the story; a visual plan is still a vital component
 - Explore more audience connection and stagecraft



PEP visits start up again



PEP (Preparing Exceptional Performances) is designed to prepare our choruses to present exceptional performances at rehearsal, on a show, or in performances around the community.

Choruses have the opportunity to invite talented Region 13 PEP faculty to provide education in vocal production, showmanship, chorus operations, membership growth/retention, PVIs, music team training, marketing, show production, and more. Together, we work to provide the educational support your chorus needs.

Every chorus can receive one PEP visit a year. Most visits would take place on a weeknight at rehearsal; or, a weekend visit may be scheduled as needed.

Region 13 funds transportation costs for the PEP visit. Choruses cover the faculty's meals and hotel accommodations, unless other agreements are made. If a session exceeds six hours of the faculty member's time, the chorus pays their regular coaching fees for all hours over the six.
