Meet the "professor!"



Caitlin Castelino is our featured speaker for the weekend. Caitlin, a 24-year member of Sweet Adelines, has been on the International Faculty since 2020. She is the Master 600 director of <u>Diablo Vista Chorus</u> (the 2020 Harmony Classic AA Champions and 2024 8th place international medalist), and baritone of <u>LoveNotes</u> (the 2014 International Quartet Champions). Thursday: kicking off the event

Thursday starts with PVIs and quartet coaching in the afternoon, plus a kickoff Thursday night. If you are interested in either option, there is a place on the <u>registration form</u> to sign up, but hurry; the spots are limited. (By the way, Friday, Saturday and Sunday breakfasts are included with your hotel reservations!)

Friday: the action starts

Educate yourself! On Friday, our incredible faculty will be teaching and there's something for everyone. We have **five tracks available**: Administrative Leaders; Directors; Visual Communications; General Membership; and, Quartets. Some of your favorite faculty are returning and some new faces, too.

Classes available include "Creating Shows That Reach the Audience;" a two-part "How to Make Your At Home Practice Efficient & Effective;" "Relaxation, Resonance, and Ring "(the sweet spot in your voice); "Let's Do Theater From the Risers," and much more. You won't want to miss this! A list of all classes will be sent out soon.

Friday night has something brand new! Caitlin will lead the class "Fun and Productive Rehearsals," which features a demonstration chorus. **YOU** can participate! Just check the box when registering to indicate your interest. The demo chorus will be singing "It's a Good Day," and being off paper for your part is required. Music and tracks are available here. Attend this interactive class to participate in a live rehearsal with techniques that make the riser time fun and productive. Musical leaders will learn effective ways to run rehearsals, and singers will add tools to their vocal skills toolbox.

Saturday's schedule

Saturday is all about Caitlin as she leads four classes in the main ballroom throughout the day. You won't want to miss: "The Vocal Mechanism: How Does It Work?;" "Calibrate Your Sound;" (followed by lunch on your own); "PVIs Under Glass;" and "Keep that Voice Young and Healthy."

Saturday dinner: Your SET registration includes a Saturday night meal, which will have something for everyone! The dinner menu will be announced soon.

Saturday evening fun features an incredible Show of Champions performances, followed by a SET favorite: the Novice Quartet / VLQ Extravaganza! If you are interested in either option, there is a place at the end of the main <u>registration form</u> that will take you to a separate form to sign up.

Tag, you're it! Also on Saturday evening: a tag room will have us singing into the late hours of the evening!

"It's in the Can" is back!

This contest is a longstanding tradition at SET. Proceeds benefit the Young Singers Fund (YSF), support the SAI Rising Star Quartet winners placing 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} , support scholarships for college-bound students studying music, and support grant programs such as after-school programs and Young Women in Harmony events. Get creative with your chorus' "can!" Encourage your members to bring in their spare change to rehearsals, and start collecting!

There will be prizes! Voting categories for this year's entries will be announced soon. Winners will be awarded small trophies, and the chorus collecting the highest dollar amount donation will receive a prize. Please bring the collected change or a check made out to NxNW Region 13. In 2022, our region raised nearly \$4,500 for our Young Singers Fund through our "It's in the Can" drive!


