Heart of the Northwest Award

Congratulations to **Diane Hollifield**, Region 13's Heart of the Northwest (HOTNW) recipient! Diane, a **Capital City Sound Chorus** core member since 1970, has mentored hundreds of new members over the span of 55 years. She greets guests, and helps them make lasting connections with the director and members. She has competed at every chorus contest and attended international contest five times.

Currently, Diane is our Management Team Assistant Events Coordinator, mentor, historian, and caroling scheduler. Previously, she was president for five terms, coordinated our 25th anniversary show, and sang lead in three registered quartets.



Diane is responsible for recruiting and supporting new members and has befriended many youth members. When our chorus almost lost its charter due to a limited number of members, she was instrumental in bringing in new people to maintain our charter.

At age 87, Diane is a fully involved chorus member with near-perfect attendance. Since 1970, she has been on the Management Team or Board of Directors almost every year, and has worked on most chorus committees or been chairperson. She has organized chorus events and performances for 55 years and participated in every director search. She often hosts sectionals, out of town guests, quartets, and regional faculty in her home.

Diane helps plan, organize, and set up about eight to ten events per year, including all-day coaching and lunch, installation of officers, and our chorus' day of caroling and Christmas party. She's a born helper who requires no accolades. When everything goes smoothly, Diane is happy. She can make decisions and do her share of physical labor, too, even at 87!

One example of Diane's dedication to our chorus was in September 2024. Our chorus had been invited to participate in the Meridian Arts Day event, held outside in a popular Boise area park. We had a call time of 9:30am and performed in the bandshell. Diane was there early to help set up! We then ran an all-day interactive booth, teaching tags to community members. Diane stayed late singing with community members, encouraging them to try different parts, and inviting them to sing with us for the holiday season. After a short break, we were off to the Warhawk Air Museum to sing for a private party celebrating a Marine's 100th birthday. At age 87, Diane participated the entire day. We were short on leads, so Diane changed her plans and made sure she was there.

The Idaho Press recently ran a front-page article about our chorus. As part of this article, they interviewed Diane and our youngest member, a 12-year-old girl whom Diane has mentored. In fact, for this girl's recent birthday, Diane helped arrange a gift of her very own pitch pipe. This is just one of many examples of how Diane connects with and inspires all members of our chorus. She embodies the spirit of Sweet Adelines with her warmth, welcoming attitude, and the way she mentors and nurtures guests and new members. She always strives to improve and is open to change!

Diane has sometimes shared stories of "how the organization was 50 years ago," or "how she and her quartet costumed themselves for the stage." A favorite story was how she and other members got stuck in an elevator at contest and had to be rescued by (wait for it!) some good-looking firemen! Diane embodies the continuity of our chorus, and does more than is asked. She fully supports both of our annual fundraisers, bakes at home for our bake sale, generously stores items, transports them to location, and works on wrapping all of the baskets for our Silent Auction. If something is happening in chorus, chances are Diane will be there!

Sweet Adelines is built and thrives on the backs of small choruses. Without them, we wouldn't be what we are today. This entire organization relies on members like Diane, the ones behind the scenes, the ones encouraging us all to be better, the ones in small choruses who give their all to ensure their one small chorus is brilliant and successful. Diane is a true leader, loving, generous, full of joy and love from her heart to others. She does this through dedication and song. She inspires us all to be the best we can be, and she truly embodies what it means to be a Sweet Adeline.


