f When we are again together, I sing baritone in the f Harmony of f theGorge chorus in Hood River, Oregon. I am also their webmaster, marketing, and assistant director.

The Venue Acquisitions Specialist position is a relatively new position in Region 13 for searching out venues within the region for future activities and events and getting contracts in place after obtaining regional approval.

However, with the pandemic in 2020, my role took on new responsibilities which in the spring included heading up a committee (Janet Donahue, Valorie Osterman, and Denise Thompson) to cancel our 2020 contest-related contracts (without any penalties). Then

recently, when SAI canceled all 2021 regional contests, I've been working with the hotels and convention center again. As you might guess, the tourism industry has been terribly affected by COVID-19 and many of our familiar faces in the DoubleTree and Centennial hotels, and ones that we worked with in the convention center, are still laid off or have moved on.

A good example in a sad year: The Centennial Hotel, which has been our overflow hotel since the regions merged in 2014, looked at our contracts for 2021 and 2022. Once they learned that 2021 was canceled and realizing that we might not need overflow rooms in 2022, they offered (yes, offered) to cancel immediately both our 2021 and 2022 contracts without any penalty.

Nancy Kurth is a member of the Northwest Harmony and Pride of Portland choruses and sings bass in RAVE quartet. As the Region 13 General Education Specialist Special Projects, she takes on special assignments as assigned by the Regional Education Coordinator. CHORUS HISTORY

Pride of Portland

Though Pride of Portland Chorus began in 2000, we've now celebrated 50 plus years under the Blue Lake Charter of 1968.



Blue Lake and Willamette Sound had each won Region 24 championships, bu if these winners joined into one stronger, internationally competitive chorus? Consequently, members dissolved Willamette Sound and renamed Blue Lake to Pride of Portland, keeping Blue Lake's charter. On December 31, 2000, Pride of Portland Chorus was born. It won its first regional competition in 2001 and finished in tenth place at its first International contest later that year.

Portland was nurtured and developed by key musical leaders, including Yvonne Whedon, Tim McCormic, Mike McCormic, Nancy Kurth, and Zoe Thompson.



A director search brought Ryan Heller, who came with impeccable credentials and relentless drive. At the 2003 Region 24 Competition, Ryan won the Novice Director Award while Pride of Portland won the regional championship. Ryan shaped the chorus with education, vision, and a love of barbershop, and in 2013, Pride of Portland earned Ryan the position of Master 700 Director. Ryan departed in 2019, to continue his choral music career in Texas. Under his leadership, the chorus won eight regional championships and five top ten international finishes.

In November 2018 Pride of Portland, by now in region 13, embarked on a director search. They were thrilled to find Drew Osterhout, a Pacific Northwest native, who spent years honing his barbershop skills with the four-time Barbershop Harmony Society (BHS) championship chorus, the Ambassadors of Harmony. Drew is Head Clinician for Harmony Explosion Northwest, as well as faculty for Harmony College Northwest, and

Rolling Hills

Rolling Hills Chorus (RHC) is celebrating our 40th anniversary as a Sweet Adelines chapter this year. In 1978 a group of women met at the Lower Valley Musical Comedy while singing in the chorus in a production. During the time they were not on stage, they began singing different barbershop arrangements that were supplied by Joan Jones. Joan had been in the **Spokane Chorus** before moving to Prosser. In Prosser, she joined a double quartet with women who were also interested in starting a Sweet Adeline chorus in the Lower Valley. The chorus became a prospective chorus in 1978 with Joan Jones as director and was located in Prosser, WA. RHC chartered in August of 1980. We participated in Regional Competition for the first time in April of 1981 in Seattle, and have competed in every competition since then except for the one held in Alaska in 1982.

In 1984 Lori Lyford became our director for 10 years before leaving to direct the amazing Scottsdale Chorus. Evelyn Weiss became our interim director until Duane Brecto came on board as our director in 1995 but only stayed a year, so again Evelyn stepped in to direct us. In 1997 Cris Conerty became our director until May of 2005 at which time Lucy Heinkel became interim director. In September of 2005 Lucy became our official director and remains so today. In 2006 at Competition in Spokane, we placed 1st in Division A and 4th overall and Lucy received the Novice Director Award, which was a great start to her career with RHC. After being based in Prosser for more than 15 years, RHC decided to move our rehearsals 35 miles to the Tri-Cities. We are blessed to have the support of the City of Pasco and enjoy singing at and helping with city events. Hopefully we will be able to get back to our rehearsal hall sometime soon.



Every year until 2020, RHC has put on an annual show with themes such as Showboat, Roaring 20s, the 40s, 50s, Broadway, Pirates, Clowns, USO, and others. But our all-time favorite is our "Laugh In, Sing Out" show of the 60's. It has been our audience favorite as well.

One of our greatest fun memories was singing the National Anthem at the Seattle Mariners baseball game in September 2013, a highlight for our chorus. The Mariners apologized that there were only 19,000 attendees plus the broadcast audience. On a Monday Evening!

Our most recent major performance was in February 2020, as we joined with the women's voices of the Mid-Columbia Mastersingers to present a concert in honor of the 100th anniversary of the



19th Amendment to the US Constitution. We were impressed at how they pulled together the entire concert in a six-week project, while their singers were amazed at our ability to sing without sheet music or accompaniment while also doing choreography. Both groups learned a
