Her training and experience working in public education as a teacher, instructional coach and administrator helped prepare her for her current role as one of the Region's Educational Specialists. Cheryl helps provide training for the Regional Faculty members in the process of teaching and learning. She is helping to develop a framework for instructional practices that is consistently used throughout the Region by faculty as they plan and prepare for their outreach to membership. The challenge this year of going totally online provided her with new learning opportunities as she

supported faculty in teaching Zoom classes at this year's Area Schools. She enjoys working oneon-one with faculty as they prepare for their classes and workshops. In the future, she is hoping to find ways to connect the educational framework more closely to coaching opportunities that the Regional Faculty members engage in across the region. She finds it fascinating to see the creative ways that our faculty members engage choruses and quartet members when they coach and teach. "I see my job as finding new ways to make that coaching and teaching STICK so it isn't forgotten when the session is over."

Currently, Cheryl is the Team Coordinator for **Spirit of Spokane Chorus** and sings baritone in **SnapShot! Quartet** with Cris Conerty (lead), Melody Martz (bass), and Laura Lambert (tenor). A couple of highlights of her 20 years in Sweet Adelines would include her very first International contest with her chorus in Atlanta (1999), and singing on the International stage in Las Vegas with **SnapShot!** when they were a wild card competitor from our region (2017).


