Our June 7 eBlast included an article that talked about when we might be able to sing together again, face to face. I so wish I could tell you that the time has come, but as we are all aware, Covid 19 is still ravaging our country. Hopefully everyone is doing their part to bring this under control by wearing masks, social distancing, and being cautious about social gatherings.

Zoom rehearsals are fantastic, as far as they go. They are keeping us connected safely, providing us opportunities to learn new music, techniques and theory while having fun with themes, costumes, and games. But we need a little hope that the day is coming when we can stand side by side on the risers once again.

I looked around social media and the Internet for some promising indications for us "super spreaders" and a post-Zoom world. Here are a few things I found.



This is an interesting idea and a step in the right direction. The ad states: "The Singer's Mask was developed by singers FOR singers by Broadway professionals to help contain droplets while allowing space around the mouth to sing comfortably." The price is \$23.50, with bulk discounts. A YouTube video demonstrates its use. Has anyone tried this mask yet? If so, perhaps you would share a review in our next eBlast!

An article by Joseph G. Allen in the Washington Post (7/14/2020) lists several reasons for optimism. These include new therapeutic treatments that are being developed and tested; rapid, low-cost saliva tests are coming which will allow us to test ourselves at home; the evidence that mask wearing is working; science showing that past exposure to common cold coronaviruses might play a protective role for some people; and VACCINE TRIALS SEEM TO BE WORKING.

Drug manufacturers have said they might be able to deliver doses as early as October and a vaccine may be available within the next 12 months. However, additional time will be needed to manufacture and distribute the vaccines, and it will take some time for people to get vaccinated. While it seems far off in the distant future, in reality this would be the quickest a vaccine has ever been developed. It is our best defense against the virus and our greatest hope for singing together again. Our day will come!

Director Highlight

Judy Beckman

Judy Beckman is in her 11th year directing **Harmony of the Gorge** chorus, having served previously as an assistant director and as a co-director (with Judy Galloway).

8-track tape.

Between classes, practice, rehearsals and non-credited requirements, an average day is between 12 and 14 hours. After graduation, I got a job teaching music at a middle school in Hawaii. Upon returning to the mainland, I began my own business teaching preschool children a combination of music and drama. CHORUS HISTORY

Helena Xpress Singers

The first meeting of the Helena Sweet Adelines was in January 1972. Founding members of the chorus included Carrie Cleveland, Bertie Lou Chamberlain, Marlene (Vaughn) Petersen, June Easton and Shirley Cadby. The first director of the chorus was Mary Lou Graff, followed by Bob Crebo. Ray Champlin directed us when we received our charter in 1974 as the Sleeping Giant Chapter of Sweet Adelines International. Linda (Phinney) Wulf is the only active charter member of the chorus, and has been a continuous member for 47 years. Champlin also directed us in our first show "Happiness Is Harmony" May 17, 1975.

Other directors were Gaye Davenport, Brenda Henry, Marlene Petersen, Sheila (Finstad) Reisch, Elizabeth Keller, Roger Morton, and Shelly Pardis. Barb Leland has been our director for the last four years. We celebrated 46 years as an official Sweet Adeline chorus in 2020. In 2005 we changed our name to Acapella Jubilee Xpress, before becoming the **Helena Xpress Singers** in 2008.

Gaye Davenport was our director when we competed in our first regional competition in 1977, where we received the Novice Chorus award. The chorus has received 4th and 5th place medals overall, and a 3rd place small chorus medal under the direction of Elizabeth Keller; as well as earning most improved chorus on several occasions.

The chorus has put on numerous shows over the years, and now typically puts on two shows a year, one is a youth talent search, and a free Christmas show with our Christmas guest chorus members. We currently have 31 members, and are excited to have just finished our first virtual choir production.

Inland Harmony Chorus

In 1969, a small group of women gathered to listen to a presentation given by Zoe Thompson, a Sweet Adeline representative and director, from the Seattle area. Even though they had little to no experience in barbershop singing, they decided it sounded like fun, and so the chapter began. In June of 1969, the *Lewis-Clark* chapter of Sweet Adelines was chartered with an initial 23 members. A gentleman named Kay Crook became our director. According to historic minutes, he was a member of the "society", presumably the Barbershop Society and brought experience to the group. The group originally rehearsed and board meetings were held in Lewiston, Idaho. One member from this original group, Jane Johnson, is still singing with the chorus and is a former director. Singing keeps a person young!

The group grew as women from Pomeroy, Pullman, Moscow, Genessee, Juliettta, Kendrick, and Colfax came to join. With this large geographic area represented, we decided it was time to change our name to reflect this. The growing group alternated rehearsals between the valley and the top of the hill for a number of years. We now rehearse in Genessee, half way between the valley and the top of the hill. In 1989, we became **Inland Harmony Chorus** and are still known as such today. The chorus has ranged in size from 19-30 singers. We have 24 active members at this time. Our amazing co-directors are Becky Pope and LuAnn Scott.

We have been represented by several quartets over the years, *including J.L.'s*, *Hi Lites*, *Axidentals*, *The Sisters*, *Idaho Gems*, *Wheathearts*, *Good Vibrations*, and presently, *Classyfied Ads*.

In May, 2019 we presented our 50th Anniversary show, where each of us wore a costume from years gone by.
