MEMBERS COMMUNICATION SURVEY RESULTS

Thank You to All Who Completed the Members Communication Survey!

The Communications Team met in August to review the results of the survey and to begin developing a list of priority tasks to work on.

We had 263 members complete the survey, which is about a 28% return rate. Of those who responded, 15 requested a personal contact. The team is in the process of contacting these individuals for additional input.

Some Key Survey Results

The top five communication resources are:

- InTune 71.82%
- Convention Website 64.09%

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5. Facebook – 60.45%

The three most important sources for regional information are:

- . Chapter Leader Update
- eBlasts
- 3. Convention Website

62% of members who responded to the survey said they keep their member profile updated on the Members Only website.

Of the quartets that responded, 12.62% have recently reviewed their information on the public website, 18.69% have not, and 13.55% reported that they would like to have a Region 13 Facebook group established just for quartet connections.

The areas most used on the public and Members Only website are:

- 1. Events Information
- 2. Convention Information
- 3. General Information
- 4. Calendar
- Regional Music
- Education

Most members responded that they do not use the documents portion of the Members Only website and 13.55% responded that they needed training on the website.

We received many excellent comments related to information that members would like to see on the website. Some examples of the comments are:

- · New music.
- · Quartet stories.
- · New recruitment materials and ideas.
- · Maybe info on what other choruses do to raise additional funds.
- Quartets for Hire region-wide.
- A "search" feature.
- Front and center the region's chapter goals and a diversity/inclusion section. Can you also put something about how to join a chorus.
- Easier to access info.
- · Networking for people who would like to quartet.
- Music education, podcasts on vocal techniques, info on current trends in costuming and makeup.
- · Anything that would help our chorus with membership recruiting and marketing.
- · eBlast archives with an index.

Suggestions received for more effective communications were:

- More welcoming to new members, available resources etc.
- Send emails directly to regional members if the information is pertinent to each member.
- More emails with a single topic. Easy for me to delete if I am not interested, easy for me
 to find if I am interested, and much easier that wading through multi-topic emails and
 InTunes.
- Continue to have liaisons in each chorus who can help communicate regional information as needed.
- Simplify the eBlasts. Sometimes they are difficult to navigate and often require going to the website to get the full information.
- · Please make it timely and accurate.
- I think current communication strategies are pretty effective. Using more platforms
 might reach more members. Maybe the biggest roadblock is that members need to
 actually sign up for communications on their preferred platform.
- The eBlast works great! Having the Chapter Leaders follow up helps make sure all chorus members are informed. Posting the same info on Facebook might be a good option.
- · Communicate more often. Bi-monthly.
- More frequent in InTune Publications.
- In person meetings or video communications.

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- This survey is great start. Also, have really enjoyed the Saturday education sessions.
- Video messages, more frequent messaging.
- Provide more frequent articles in eBlasts
- RMT Q&A sessions covering specific topics submitted by members
- Mass emails for emergent issues

Stay tuned to the next eBlast which will highlight some of the tasks that were created from the survey results. Thanks again to all the Region 13 members -YOU ROCK!
