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Say What?!?

At the date of this writing, we have 15 rehearsals until the Region 13 competition in Anchorage, Alaska! It seems like such a long time, but in reality, it is never enough time!

This article is devoted to ways you can improve your practice time, give more to your chorus, and, in general, be the best chorus member you can be.

First, take a look at the chorus member you are now.

Are you an exemplary chorus member or are you resting on the person next to you when you know you shouldn't be? Are you early to rehearsal, ready to hit the risers right on time? Do you have your music learned, choreography plan committed to memory, and emotional plot mapped out?

I would encourage all chorus members to do these basic things during contest season:

- Be on time and ready to sing.
- Warm up in the car or at home before rehearsal.
- Know the music and any changes that have been made so that you don't waste rehearsal time

asking questions that may have been answered previously.

- Pay attention to any notes or emails that come out during the week with musical changes.
- · Keep healthy.

What if you already do all of those things? And, if you are reading this, I bet you do! Here are some ideas for above and beyond!

- Take stock of your inner game. Many Olympic athletes swear their success is due to their inner game. Confidence and lack of outside negative voices help them to win gold medals.
- Warm up every day. Go out and get one of those vocal warm-up CDs, like "Sing, Baby, Sing" (available at www.singers.com)and sing every day.
- Keep yourself healthy.
 Sleep as much as you need to and limit alcohol and caffeine. Quit smoking.
 Take your vitamins, hydrate, eat a balanced diet and get some exercise.
- If you can't sing through your contest package out

loud, then do it in your head!

- Practice your music every day. Running through your contest package once a day can really solidify any changes that were made during the week and can help choreography become second nature.
- Demand more from yourself. People's inner dialogue limits what they think they can do. We put limits on our potential without even realizing it! So, every time you think you can't possibly do another run-through, sing the song any better, or remember one more detail, challenge yourself to dig deeper and find more energy and brain power!

I will see you all in just a few months – and until then, keep healthy, keep practicing and become the chorus member you've always wanted to be!
