The judges, plus our own Region 13 judges Beth Smith and Susan Kegley, shared ideas, hints, concepts, and trends to help our choruses and quartets take that next big step in improvement.

In addition to the sharing of information and ideas, this gathering also provides a great networking opportunity for our region's directors. Whether your chorus competed or not; whether your chorus has 16 singers or 116 singers; whether you are in remote areas of Alaska or Montana or in metro Portland or Seattle—every director shares many of the same issues and challenges. Where better to gain additional approaches and strategies to work through these issues? It's fun to discover we're all working on the same things, just at different levels.

This morning breakfast event will continue with our 2016 Regional Competition as long as our Judging Panel agrees to delay their departure times and volunteer their time and talents to share with us. We are very grateful for their willingness to be so gracious with their time and talent.

Then click on the "Education Scholarship Information and Application" link to access the application form. All the submission directions are included on the form.

Contest 2015—Judges' Comments

Each year contest judges give us regional score sheets for all the chorus and quartet competitors as a whole. Of course these regional score sheets do not necessarily apply to an individual chorus or quartet. But they do help us as a region focus our education efforts for the coming year. Choruses and quartets may also want to use these regional score sheets in conjunction with their own individual score sheets. You can find a copy of these regional score sheets on the Members Only site.

Summary of comments—CHORUS competition:

Doing well:

- Vocal skills (always continue to strengthen or develop further)
 - * lower scoring choruses: good basic foundation in vocal skills
 - * higher scoring choruses: good vocal skills
- Music selection generally good, especially for higher scoring choruses
- Open Division brought fun and good entertainment—some fun stuff
- Visual plans are appropriate for the level of singing and generally well designed

Focus improvement efforts on:

- Consistent vocal skills, especially consistent vowel production
- Intervals—raise awareness of what it means to get “up & over” intervals to be on the top side of pitches
- Synchronization
- Balance roundness (resonance) with ring (forward placement in the mask)
- Lower scoring choruses:
 - * Tempo choice, pulse, and backbeat
 - * Interpretive plans including dynamics and musical energy
 - * Selecting appropriate, strong contest music
- Taking advantage of interpretation possibilities in our arrangements

Summary of comments—QUARTET competition:

Doing well:

- Vocal skills

- Singing with resonance
- Basses maintained presence in their lower range
- Use of tune-up chord before singing
- 31 quartets! Great regional support for each contestant
- Generally good selection of music that fits the performer, especially higher-scoring quartets
- Pretty good energy overall
- Makeup/grooming, hairstyles
- Nice attention to costuming details, i.e. black socks with black pants

Focus improvement efforts on:

- Consistent vocal skills, more attention at B- and lower levels
- Breath support, musical unity including stronger breath plans
- Singing with forward placement
- Dynamics, tempo, and rhythm
- Phrasing a ballad
- Picking appropriate music for the current skill level, especially lower scoring quartets
- Musical energy
- Musical artistry
- More zest when entering the stage, especially when coming from the middle

During an oral debrief with the judges, they encouraged us to celebrate our small choruses. The judges reminded us that small choruses around the world are scoring at unprecedented levels on the international stage. Exceptional performance is found in choruses of all sizes. Our judges encouraged our small choruses to shift their thinking—exceptional performance is no longer the realm of only large choruses! Let's believe in the power of small and mighty!

We have much to celebrate as a region. We are doing so many things well! And by using our regional score sheet along with our individual score sheets, we have a map to focus our journey's efforts for the coming year!

RMT Report

The Regional Management Team met on June 5-6, 2015 in Portland, OR. Together, we:

- Reviewed the Region 13 Strategic Plan and developed action plans for 3 strategies
- Developed plans for visiting all the choruses in Region 13 over the next 3 years.

- Updated Region #13 Standing Rules
- Reviewed and approved job descriptions for Region 13 committees
- Worked with Communications Coordinator Pat Breen to complete the annual State of the Region Report.

Membership Coordinator Sharon Stockstad presented criteria for the Heart of the Northwest Award and suggestions for the Historian job description.

Marketing Coordinator Jo Sahlin reported on the plans for our "Rah Rah" activities in Las Vegas to support *Alaska Sound Celebration Chorus* and the quartets (Regional Champion *Pepper*, returning top 10 *international Frenzy*, and Wildcards *PrimeTime*, *The Four Get Me Nots*, and *SoundFX*) who will be representing our region in the International Competition. She also reported on the proposed Marketing Policy for outside vendors.

Finance Coordinator Danie Stiles brought copies of the 2014 income tax form. She will be working

with the Events Coordinator to update the job description for Harmony Emporium Coordinator. Directors Coordinator Nancy Kurth reported on the progress of the Director Buddy Program assignments, the Regional Arrangers Program to be presented during Harmony College Northwest, Director scholarships, and the new addition to our Region 13 website called "[The Coaching Connection](#)."

Education Coordinator Debra Aungst brought us up to date on plans for August 21-22 SET, area schools, and Quartet Workshop. She shared the 2015 Region 13 Judges Summary Comments and the five-year education plans.

Events Coordinator Judy Galloway reported about the very successful 2015 Regional Convention and Competition. She also outlined plans for the 2016 Convention and Competition.
