The Region 13 Convention Team is happy to report we heard your feedback! Based on that, we have made positive changes that will impact all members and create an exciting, pleasurable 2025 contest experience. In addition, we reviewed and made changes to the convention budget, which are outlined below.



2025 Convention/Contest Enhancements

- Saturday evening Afterglow: Designated room for choruses and quartets to perform
- Sunday morning with available judges: "Meet & Greet" opened to all Region 13 members; breakfast not provided
- Judges Green Room assignment: Closer proximity to the judges' pit
- Hotel/Convention Center third floor breezeway: Directional arrows/lanes for a better flow of traffic
- Contest seating configuration: Staggered for better contest viewing

2025 Convention Contest/Budget Savings

- The Convention Team meets via Zoom
- Events Coordinator (EVC), Chair of the Regional Convention (CRC), Convention Coordinator (CC), and Facilities Specialist meet in person for one day at the beginning of Convention/Contest Year
- Candid photos eliminated. Only Friday and Saturday contests will be photographed.
- Back-to-back Order of Appearance contest sheets will be printed with a larger font and additional writing space for each contestant.
- Convention/contest signage development and printing in-kind contribution
- AETs will not be mailed; they will be available for pick-up at Registration

We're adding ads!

Does your chorus or quartet have a super fundraiser coming up? Maybe you have a business that caters to Sweet Adelines. Is your quartet searching for that perfect baritone? Do you specialize in logo wear, chorus novelties, special classes, and coaching or voice lessons? If so, you'll now have an opportunity to advertise in our region's monthly eBlasts, as well as in the InTune, our twice-a-year newsletter. But wait, there's more! All the "Looking for a director" ads will be free!

Here are some details:

- **eBlast ads** cost \$50* and can be no more than 2.25" high and will be the full width of the eblast (~6" on a computer monitor; size will vary depending on your viewing device). Eblasts are sent to the entire Region 13 mailing list. ** **Special offer:** Purchase two eblast ads and get a third one free! They can be in the same or different eblast.
- InTune ads are \$50 for a quarter page (horizontal or vertical); \$100 for a half-page (horizontal or vertical), and \$175 for a full page. InTune newsletters are sent late January early February and in June. Issues are sent electronically to the entire Region 13 mailing list.
- Ads in either publication can be in color or black and white. The buyer must supply the copy and artwork (though we're happy to offer a helping hand if you need one!).




DE&I Committee updates

Happy New Year Region 13! Your DE&I Committee is doing something different this year, starting with a new raising awareness campaign. Each month, we will feature information on a current month's Awareness Days. January is chockful of these important days, so we narrowed it down to three. We hope you will find this new campaign interesting.

January 4: World Braille Day. Established by the United Nations to celebrate awareness of the importance of braille in education, communication, and social inclusion in the full realization of the human rights for blind and visually impaired people. It is celebrated on January 4, the anniversary of when its founder, Louis Braille, was born.

January 20: Martin Luther King Jr. Day. This day is a celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday, a day to promote equal rights for all Americans, regardless of their background. Dr. King was an important civil rights activist and a leader in the



movement to end racial segregation in the United States. His most famous address was the "<u>I</u> <u>Have A Dream</u>" speech. He was an advocate of non-violent protests and became the youngest man to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. He was assassinated in 1968. January 20, 2025 marks the 30th anniversary as a National Day of Service.

January 27: Holocaust Memorial Day. Often abbreviated as HMD, this day is dedicated to remembering the victims of the Holocaust and other genocides. It's a time for reflection, education, and raising awareness about the consequences of discrimination, hatred, and prejudice; a day that encourages individuals and communities to stand together against hatred and persecution. This year marks the 80th anniversary of the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp's liberation.
