

Time Zone

Las Vegas is located in the Pacific Time Zone. That means that it is two hours earlier there than here. Take that into account when planning.

Weather

In October, the weather in Las Vegas is expected to be in the high 70s to low 80s during the day and in the 60s at night. Sounds like we're in for a lovely break in temperatures.

Hotel Tips and Tricks

The following information has been provided by SAI for our consideration while visiting Baltimore for competition:

- When you arrive, determine the most direct route to and from your hotel to the nearest fire escapes, telephone and elevators.
- Use the door viewer to identify anyone requesting room entry. Only open the door if you are certain that the person requesting entry is legitimate. If there is any question, call the front desk.
- Report any lost or stolen items to hotel management and to the police. Always lock cash, checks, credit cards, jewelry, electronics and other valuables in the hotel safety deposit box.

Transportation from the Airport

You will need to arrange for transportation from the airport to the MGM Grand Hotel. Before you arrive. There are a number of shuttle services available. You can find the list on the SAI website with the other convention information. Several in the chorus have already booked using Super Shuttle for a cost of \$11 per person one way or \$20 round trip. McCarran International Airport is a five-minute drive from the MGM Grand Hotel & Casino. Upon landing, follow the directional

signs and board the shuttle transport to baggage claim. PLEASE NOTE: Make sure the marquee reads "transportation to baggage claim". Boarding the wrong shuttle could result in you being

If you would prefer to use a taxi, the following information will be of use to you:

Terminal 1—Taxis are available on the east side of baggage claim, outside door exits 1-4.

Terminal 3—Taxis are located outside on Level Zero.

There are 20 taxi loading positions on the west end of the building available for our use.

FYI, the tax rate in Las Vegas is 8.15%. This might help you in planning how much money you will need to take.

Scooters/Wheelchairs

The MGM Grand is an ADA-compliant facility. As we have been informed, it is an extremely large property, requiring lengthy walking at times. If you are unable to comfortably walk several blocks back and forth, it is recommended that you rent a wheelchair or scooter to avoid issues on site. **Scootaround** is proud to be the preferred scooter and wheelchair rental service for this event.

Travel Tips

A wise traveler will not pack valuables in suitcases. Carry with you onto the plane anything of value that cannot be replaced. This would include, jewelry, money, etc. Please review the following guidelines about what you can take as carry-on luggage (may vary with different airlines):

- ↑ Pre-screening: No more than 3 ounces of liquid may be carried in your carry-on. Liquid containers must fit comfortably in a ONE-quart-size, clear plastic zip-top bag. This specifically relates to prescription liquids, which must have a prescription label on the container and match with your boarding pass and ID. Check with your airline if in doubt.
- → Other medical equipment such as a breathing machine. Call a few days ahead of time with flight number, seat assignment, etc. to make arrangements for your equipment. Otherwise, if they do not recognize it at the gate as a necessary item, it could be mistaken for something not allowed. If you have a medical item that also requires liquid, you are advised to check with the airline ahead of time.
- ★ Check with your individual airline to learn restrictions and allowances on baggage sizes and other information and possible fees for extra bags.
- A Pack your costume, earrings, shoes and any other competition items for the semi-finals in a carry-on suitcase. Do that because (SURPRISE!) checked luggage could end up in Alaska instead of Las Vegas!
- ★ You can take on board food and beverages that have been purchased in the airport.

What to Bring

- Layers of clothing (hotels tend to be chilly)
- Refillable water bottle (water stations will be available throughout the conference center)
- Swimsuit (Grand Pool Complex, weather permitting)
- Walking shoes (Being under one roof is grand, but be ready for some walking!)

- In the rare case that you are approached by someone who intends to rob you, keep your hands in the robber's view at all times, and do not volunteer more than the robber demands. 

Let's Be Professionals

While visiting Las Vegas, we should remember that not only are we representing OK City Chorus but also SAI as a whole. Keep in mind that those who are not part of Sweet Adelines might not enjoy being interrupted by a large group of ladies being too noisy. It's always fun to break out in song when eating at a restaurant, but think twice before doing so. Perhaps it would be good to even ask the waiter if it would be okay.

Remember to be polite to and cooperative with the workers at the convention. They are only doing their job when they ask that you be seated or wait at the door until the competitors have finished performing.

Being a good audience is also important. When we're in the audience, be careful about comments made about a performance, especially if they're not positive. Those in front of or around us might be part of that group and would not appreciate hearing negative comments.

"Fifth-wheeling" means singing along as the fifth person in a quartet. Generally, the original four do not appreciate a fifth voice. So, unless you're invited to sing, just enjoy listening. You will likely have several chances to sing with a group at some point. Nobody wants to be a fifth wheel!


From Susan Gertson, Baritone Section Leader. What a great group of Baritones we are!! It is exciting to

- Shou<mark>ld you happen to miss a move, don't do it late. Ju</mark>st go on to the next one. If you drop an earring or piece of your costume, don't retrieve it during the set.
- The time will fly by. Put every ounce of your energy into every moment. We want to leave it all on the stage.

Please take care of yourself and your "instrument"!

We will have some great rehearsal time to come together. Please be on time for these mandatory rehearsals, and when it's time to start, let's get to the risers quickly and make the most of this precious time!

You worked very hard every Tuesday and in your VLQs, always receptive to vocal coaching, to musical refinement, choreography changes, finding the joy in telling your stories and allowing yourselves freedom of expression, as never before. Because we're of one mind, headed for an attainable goal, I know we'll continue to perfect our skills until the moment we're on stage, when all our preparation will burst forth into an incredible performance.



Costuming and Visual Information

Hair, Makeup and Nails:

- We will wear full stage hair and makeup.
- Nails will be French Manicures or Clear Polish
- Front Row will have French Manicures

Makeup Information: Instructions for Thursday: Chorus members will do their own foundation, eyelashes and hair before coming down to rehearsal. We will finish our makeup







in the ballroom, after rehearsal, and put on our tops. There will not be time to go back to your room; so, wear your stage undergarments and black pants and a shirt to rehearse in. Don't forget your shoes. Bring your chorus top and earrings, along with makeup, hair products (to touch up) and a mirror. The makeup team will help you with eyes and will blush you. Note: Instructions for Saturday might be different.

Hair. Don't assume that your everyday hair will be adequate for the stage. Please contact Paula Reed, if you have any questions or need help. Don't wait until the last minute to ask for help. Remember:

No clips, bows, hair bands or barrettes

Conceal all bobby pins and hair pins, if you need to use them

🦣 💮 Get hair away from ears and face—we want to see your gorgeous face and glitz on ears.

Met as much height in the crown of your hair as you can. No flat hair.

Chorus Oress Code

No jeans, please. Nice business casual clothes. You'll see others wearing everything from shorts to jeans to t-shirts, but as a chorus, we want to keep our image classy, not slouchy. You can bring your medals to wear, if you would like. Also, many people wear their part pins and other blingy jewelry.

Costumes:

Make sure that your costume is clean and wrinkle free.

Hang your costumes as soon as you arrive at the hotel.

If you are flying, put your costume (and accessories for the semi-finals) in a carry-on bag so that you'll have them if your luggage is lost. Priorities, right?

For Semi-finals—

New lime green top Black chorus pants Jet Black knee hi's/pantyhose Black chorus character shoes New earrings

Chorus Finals—

Purple top with Rhinestone Belt Buckle Purple pants New chorus earrings Nude knee hi's/pantyhose Black chorus character shoes

Makeup Application:

- Step 1 Start with a clean face and neck. Moisturize, use eye cream, lip balm and give your skin time to absorb them. Apply face and eye primers. Primers are Spanx for the face.
- Step 2 Apply your concealer either before or after your foundation—your preference.
- Step 3 Apply foundation. Whether you are using a brush, your fingers or a sponge, the goal is to tap and press, not push and rub. Because you're using a darker color, plan on using multiple layers to accomplish the task rather than one application. Blend, Blend, Blend. You must blend away all the edges into your hairline, down your neck and onto ears, unless using the leg makeup.
- Step 4 Apply Sally Hansen "Tan Glow" spray or medium lotion on neck, chest and ears before putting on top.
- Step 5 Apply MAC "White Frost" dry, over entire lid all the way to brow. Heavier on lid/lighter under brow.
- Step 6 Wet brush and dip into BARE MINERALS "Sex Kitten" and mix in lid. Apply, with eye closed, in the crease starting in the center of pupil going toward outside. Glend toward inner corner of crease. Glend above the crease line slightly. You should be able to see it with your eye open, but don't go







too high. Use more "White Frost" to blend. No sharp lines or edges.

Step 7 Use NYX Roll on Shimmer "Platinum" and roll on over the white on lid.

Step 8 Apply black eyeliner, either in pencil, cake, liquid or gel form (your preference) to base of top eye lashes, extending out at corner of the eye. This is done easiest as a series of shorter lines rather than attempting one long line. The net affect is the same. The line should be fairly bold for stage.

Step 9 Curl top lashes and apply mascara to top lashes. Apply false eyelashes to top lashes, adhering as close to base of lashes as possible. If using new lashes, trim to fit eye from outside and remove industrial adhesive. It makes them more pliable, if removed. To remove, apply lash glue, let dry and then peel it off. When applying glue for application, use a thin line on strip and let it get tacky (about one minute) before applying. Good tools to use are tweezers, toothpicks and even dental floss. After lashes are dry, touch up eye liner.

Step 10 Line under lower lashes from center point of iris to outer edge of eye. Only doing outer half

opens up the eye. Apply mascara to lower lashes.

Step 11 Emphasize eyebrows. Using a brow pencil or brow gel, apply to your brow line with short strokes. Enlarge the dimension and emphasize the arch. Note: Eyebrows are such an important part of the makeup plan. They frame the eye and should be as strong as the shadow. They MUST show from the stage. We use them to express emotion, and they must be seen.

Step 12 Using a slightly wet Q-tip, gently remove any "bleed over" from the eye makeup from under eye

by simply rolling the cotton tip under your eye. Don't rub.

Step 13 Using MAC "White Frost", lightly apply a blended line above your eyebrows and inner corner of eyes.

Step 14 Correct inconsistencies you see in your foundation.

Step 15 Get Blushed.

Step 16 Powder face with your setting powder.

Step 17 Line lips with lip pencil and fill in with lip pencil. Apply lipstick, blot with tissue. Lightly dust with powder and reapply lipstick. Apply gloss.

You might want to visit rehearsals of other choruses throughout the week to cheer on friends. The times and locations of all chorus rehearsals can be found on the http://sweetadelines.com/events/ lasvegas2016convention/competingchorushousingandrehearsalinfo/. Print out that page before you go, and you'll have it at hand when needed. Many of the choruses will have last-minute coaching from some wellknown coaches, which will provide an educational experience for visitors. The schedule might be posted near SAI headquarters in Las Vegas as well. Our rehearsals will be open to guests. So, be prepared to have an audience at our rehearsals.. Be sure to let any friends who will be in Vegas know when our extra rehearsals are. Rah Rahs for our regional choruses will be as follows: Tuesday, 4:00, Springfield Metro Chorus, room 113; Wednesday, 1:45, Rich-tone Chorus, room 116; and Wednesday, 3:15, OK City.

Tentative Schedule

The schedule that follows begins on Monday with some general information that you might find useful. Some who are arriving before that time will be able to find things to do by checking out the SAI website for tours or the hotel information books. You will also receive an official schedule of convention events when you get your registration packet.

Traffic Pattern Information

Staff and convention assistants meet you at the competitor arrival location in the MGM Grand Garden Arena foyer. They will ensure that each group is escorted to the proper location at the appropriate times. Chorus members use an escalator from the foyer to the lower level where the holding and warm-up rooms are located; be sure to tell your chorus members. Make sure all members of your chorus step on and off of the escalators slowly. If any member is uncomfortable using escalators, please fill out the Notice of Special Circumstances found in the Pre-competition Forms section.

Holding and Warm-up

Upon arrival, we will be directed to the holding and warm-up areas. We are allowed 10 minutes in warm-up. Timing begins after the entire chorus has entered the warm-up area.

Backstage and Stage Entrance

Space in the backstage area is quite large. We will walk down the hallway from warm-up to the onstage ramp, which is right as we round the corner to the backstage area. Please be quiet when walking to the stage. We will leave warm-up and be directed immediately to the onramp. We might be held for several minutes on the ramp or in the backstage area. During the semifinals, we will enter stage right and exit stage left. For safety purposes, please do not do any stomping routines on the ramps while entering or exiting the stage. Established guidelines for entrances and exits must be followed or risk penalty.

Purse Bags

Purse Bags Each chorus receives one large bag with handles for every 8-10 members at the semifinals briefing for storing belongings during contest. Chorus members should only bring essential items, including their tickets to enter the competition hall after performing. The bags are labeled, however, you may wish to assign one member to each bag and that it be marked in a way that she may easily recognize it. Items should be placed in the bag prior to leaving the hotel and should be distributed after leaving the backstage area. Please retain your purse bags to use, should you advance to the Finals session.




Please be considerate of the person who has to carry the bags; bring only those items that you cannot do without and that will fit in a very small bag. Do not bring your purse!
