

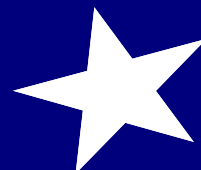

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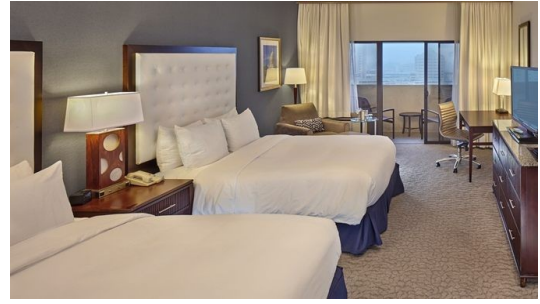

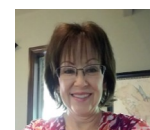
From Our Lead Leader–Barb Underwood

GENERAL CONVENTION INFORMATION

Mass Sing

Immediately following the RAMM, there will be a Mass Sing in the Marriott Ballroom, where the RAMM is being held. It should start around 2:30.

Lanyards

If you have a Region 25 lanyard that was provided at competition a few years ago, be sure to bring it with you to hold your name badge. These are not available any more; so, if you don't have one, you can bring one of your own. There is usually a vendor at the Harmony Boutique that sells them. It would be



helpful if your holder has a pocket in it in which you can put your AEP, which will be needed every time you enter the competition area.

Contest Etiquette

As guests at the Robinson Performance Hall, we should be polite to and considerate of the ushers and other workers at this event. When the emcee steps up to the podium, we will need to be seated. If you are caught outside the performance hall, the ushers will close the doors. Please don't ask them to let you into the auditorium because they cannot allow you to do so out of courtesy to the chorus/quartet that is on stage. There will be an SA "bouncer" inside the door to ensure that the onstage performance is not interrupted. In order to not disturb the competitors, no talking or walking around during the performance.



Cell Phones

Mobile devices are a part of our digital world and provide wonderful things such as the ability to webcast this great contest. However, we are cautioned about the use of our cell phones while competitors are on stage. We will be asked to turn off or silence all devices during all of the competition. The light from the cell phones or tablets can be extremely distracting to those around you (not to mention the competitors). Any texting or talking should be held off until the house lights come up between competitors. Anyone who violates this request will be escorted from the auditorium.

GENERAL INFORMATION UPDATE

RISER CONFIGURATION: ALL choruses will perform on the larger set of risers.

HARMONY BOUTIQUE will now be located in the Doubletree ballroom on the 2nd floor

REGISTRATION will now be located inside Harmony Bazaar

CHAMPION BASH (formerly known as the AFTERBASH) will be in the Marriott ballrooms on the 2nd floor (Same location as the RAMM!) We will not be having the traditional Show of Champions. HOWEVER, we will have a much larger space for the CHAMPION BASH so that all choruses and quartets that are invited to sing will have a place to perform for the Region!

PHOTOGRAPHY INFORMATION

Photography/Recording

Just a reminder that only the official photographer for the region is allowed to take pictures of the performing groups. Taking candid pictures is permitted between performances. There will be ushers watching, and if you are seen taking pictures, your device might be confiscated. We are also not allowed to record any of the competition.



Competition Photography

The official photographer for the quartet and chorus competitions is Lilley Photography, who will be taking live shots during the competitions. They will start taking pictures at the end of our chorus performance as soon as we hit our final pose before the lights go down. They will take three shots; so, we will need to hold our pose until Mary releases us. We will practice our pose at rehearsal. The photographers will also be shooting during our performance and posting them on the website after contest. We will get information on how to order prints.

Lilley Photography

Picture Order

Kay Lehman is the coordinator for picture orders for our chorus. An order form, listing the sizes and prices, was sent by email a few weeks ago. The deadline for ordering pictures with the chorus is March 13. You can order after that date but you will have to do so through Lilley Photography, and you will have to pay for shipping and handling, which will increase the cost. If you have any questions, contact Kay Lehman at rehearsal or at 405-509-3117. Payment must accompany your order—make out to OK City Chorus.

Video Orders

The chorus is purchase a high definition video of our performance on a flash drive at the end of the contest along with the score sheets. Included on the flash drive will be an mp3 audio file of our performance. We will also receive unlimited use of these files, which means that members of the chorus can ask for copies. We will have more information on ordering copies after competition.

Flat-floor Rehearsal

Our flat-floor rehearsal is scheduled for 11:30-12:45 in the Porter/Hamilton room at the Robinson Center. Since we have a limited amount of time in the room, we're asking that you be on time so that we make good use of our time there. Chorus members should arrive with costumes on and hair styled. Hair and makeup checks will be done right after rehearsal.

Chorus Pattern

We are Contestant #20/ After the flat-floor rehearsal, we will return to our rooms to finish getting ready for the competition. The schedule to begin the pattern on Saturday is as follows:

What to Bring in the Pattern

You should bring as little as possible with you in the pattern. A small bag to hold your money, your AEP and maybe a few other things should be the limit. Each chorus will be provided with large bags in which to place the small bags while we are on stage. People on the ends of each row will be assigned the large bags, and we don't want them to be too heavy. Remember who has your bag so that you can easily retrieve it when we have finished competing. There will also be a place backstage to check makeup, use the restroom, fix our hair, etc. as well as a safe place to leave the bags.



If we hurry once we have competed, we will have time to reenter the auditorium to watch the last competitor—Rich Tone Chorus.

What to Wear to the RAMM

There will not be an assigned costume for the RAMM. Casual business clothes would be appropriate. Please **NO JEANS, T-SHIRTS OR ATHLETIC WEAR**. We want to represent OK City Chorus well.

What to wear for Competition

For competition we will be wearing the spirit costumes from our show. If there has been a change in your costume or if you are a new member who was not in the show, you will need to show your costume to Jenifer Allbaugh for approval. Colors are white and gray.

Champion Bash

Please wear the tops that we wore for our Open House—tops ranging in colors from lime green to royal blue with your own black pants, black shoes and accessories to match your top.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPETITION ON SATURDAY

Come down to the flat floor rehearsal with your costume on and hair styled how you are going to wear it. If you don't have grey hair, the hair team will be spraying white on your hair. That includes wigs (the color washes out). **Hair** should be disheveled looking, like when you get out of bed. Freezing hair spray is a must to hold the style. Bring your product down to rehearsal. **Makeup**—have your face primer on and bring it with you to the flat floor rehearsal. Primer is a must with this makeup. The makeup team will be applying the spirit makeup after rehearsal in the ballroom. Once your makeup is done, the hair team will check your hair. You can then go back to your rooms and apply your own black mascara and red lipstick.

Makeup Instructions

We should apply our own primer prior to going to the flat-floor rehearsal on Saturday morning. The makeup team will apply the white makeup after the. Once we are finished there, we can return to our rooms and apply our own mascara and red lipstick.

Makeup Team

The ladies who will be doing makeup will be Jen Foster, Karen Fox, Cheryl Kumor, Cheryl Standage, Casey Lambert, Zon Kordic-Binkley, Ramona Riley and Jenifer Allbaugh. We will not be assigned to a specific person; just get in line and wait for our turn.

Makeup Supplies Needed

QUARTET PERFORMANCE TIMES
