She is the choral music teacher at Chandler High School in Chandler, Arizona where her a cappella ensembles have received local, regional, and international acclaim. The current Rising Star Quartet Champions, C'est la Vie, grew up in her program.

Jana Gutenson has been a member of Sweet Adelines International since 1984, but barbershop has been in her life since birth as both her parents were barbershoppers. Jana has a BA in Music Education and an MA in Curriculum & Instruction and is a general music teacher in Chandler, Arizona. She is a certified Music Judge in Sweet Adelines and has served as the Education Coordinator for Region 21 and on the Regional Leadership Committee for the International Organization. In addition to being the Associate Director of the Scottsdale Chorus, Jana is an accomplished quartet singer, having reached the International top 10 singing baritone with Affinity.

One of the new documents is a Sample Piggyback Coaching Agreement that can be modified and used when several choruses and/or quartets share a coach during the same travel period. The Piggyback Policy basically states that when you share a coach you agree ahead of time to share the cost of transportation on a pro rata basis with coaching fees going directly to the coach. It also outlines who coordinates the time slots, deposits needed, what to do if cancellation or no shows occur. This is a great document that outlines many concerns before the arrangements are made.

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## **Frequently Asked Questions**

Do I need to obtain a "clearance" for my chorus's show dates from North by Northwest Region 13?

No, choruses do not need to get permission to schedule show dates. However, you should check the regional calendar on our website to see if your chosen dates are in conflict with any chorus shows already scheduled in your vicinity. Conflicts may result in lower attendance at your show.

When you have confirmed dates, add them to the regional calendar promptly, so others will have this information. The reality is that choruses often have little flexibility in selecting dates. We ask that you do your best to avoid competing with other choruses.

## How do I get my barbershop event on the regional calendar?

To submit an event for the regional calendar, go to the public home page of the regional website. Select the Events tab and select the Submit a Calendar Event box. Complete the online form and hit the submit button! Easy peasy!

How can I update changes to my address or email for the Region and for International?

International: Go to the SAI website. Log on to

the Members Only section. Select *More Member Options*. Click on "Update Your Info."

Region 13: Go to the regional website. Log on to the Members Only section. Select Members, then Region 13 Members. Find your name, select it, then click "Edit" and make the changes. Make sure that you hit the SAVE button at the very bottom of the page when you are finished.

## What is the best way to access information about upcoming educational events?

The best source of information is on the regional website. Events that are in the near future are typically listed on the home page with a link to a more detailed page. Events that are further away are typically listed on the Events Calendar. Just select the *Events* tab and click on *Calendar* from the drop down menu. You can always send an email inquiry to the Region's Education Coordinator.

Arranging from the Edge begins with basic guidelines and terms and then gets right into the "how to" and "hands on" of actually preparing a lead sheet, choosing chords, and assigning voice parts within an arrangement.
