(NOTE: Any fliers that promote upcoming chorus or quartet events cannot be run in the InTune due to space requirements, and should be sent to the eBlast editor at the email shown above.)
- 3. Email lists from the Region 13 website are used to communicate primarily with chapter leadership, directors, resource staff members, and quartets. <u>All Region 13 members are encouraged to</u> <u>maintain their member profiles on this site with the most current information.</u>

The **eBlast** and the **InTune** are distributed through our **Region 13 iContact** distribution list, maintained by Mindy Engelberg. This list is maintained separately from your member profile on the Members Only page of our website.

PEP PROGRAM

PEP — Preparing for an Exceptional Performance



What is the PEP Program? PEP (Preparing for an Exceptional Performance) was established to prepare our choruses for having exceptional performances – be it at rehearsal, on a show, at contest, or in a community performance. PEP provides choruses with an opportunity to acquire talented Region 13 faculty, which can provide education in the areas of vocal production, showmanship, chorus operations, mem-

bership growth and retention, PVIs, music team training, marketing, show production, and more.

When can I schedule a PEP visit? Right now! PEP visits will be tracked on an annual basis – May 1 to April 30. Choruses are eligible to receive one (1) visit per year; but depending on funding, there may be an opportunity for a second visit. PEP visits must be booked ahead of time and approved by the PEP Education Specialist. <u>NOTE: A planned coaching session cannot be turned into a PEP visit.</u>

Must a PEP visit be on a weekday? No. PEP visits may be scheduled on a weekend, if this works better for your chorus. However, PEP visits are for a maximum of six hours.

May I choose who conducts a PEP visit with my chorus? Your chorus is welcome to suggest the faculty you'd like. Please understand, however, that we need to be sensitive of coaches' personal and professional commitments, and your first choice may not be available. Additionally, we like to "share the wealth" and expose all our fantastic faculty members to our choruses. However, we'll work with you to find a coach and a day that is mutually satisfying for all. In all cases, be assured that we will carefully consider the input and requirements of the requesting chorus, and match you with a faculty member(s) best suited to your needs.

So exactly what topics are offered? Your PEP visit will be individually tailored to meet your chorus' needs and can encompass one – or multiple – topics. The PEP packet has suggested topics to get you started, and you are free to suggest others. Topics can be musical or administrative, i.e. goal setting or leadership training. Our experienced faculty is happy to work with you and provide the education you desire. Visits are flexible. You can schedule a visit for your entire chorus or for just a part of it – such as with your section leaders or administrative leaders.

What will it cost the chorus? Region 13 will fund transportation and materials costs for your PEP visit. Choruses are expected to cover the faculty's meals and hotel accommodations, unless other agreements are made. If your session exceeds six hours of the faculty member's time, you will need to pay their regular coaching fees for all hours beyond six.

Where can I find an application form? The application is available on the Region 13's website at https://sairegion13.org/. Click the > Members Only link, then click > Documents in the left drop down menu; then click on the > Education section and select > PEP. Instructions are on the form.

- HCNW and private voice lessons are not eligible for scholarship funds.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- After logging into the NxNW Region 13's **Members Only** site, click on **Documents** in the left-hand column.
- Under the **Education** heading, click the link for the **2020 Education Scholarship Fund Application**. Doing this will open up the application, which contains more detailed information and instructions on how to submit it for consideration.

Rob, a Singing Category Judge, studied voice pedagogy. Pride's new director, Drew Osterhout, resonated with Rob's straightforward, effective methods – body alignment, release of unnecessary tension, and resonance matching — and he wanted some of the *Mance Magic* for POP.

Rob listened to every singer individually, encouraging/identifying any tension area with their stance. Solutions included lying on the floor, strolling while swinging the arms, standing against a wall, and using knuckles to keep the jaw open and relaxed. Many displayed "turtle" necks, tilting heads and jaws forward of the body. Members were asked to lengthen the back of the neck while shortening the front of the neck, using the index finger to push the chin inward. Some stuck tongues out, and some pushed on the end of the tongue. The result: POP had rich, round, resonant sound!

As Vocal Standard said in a Facebook post: "Pride of Portland Ladies: take your MANCE STANCE tips and use them well." And indeed we did.
